VERB

Tener-->To Have

The verb "tener" (*teh-NEHR*) means "to have". It is an irregular verb, which means that it does not follow the normal conjugation rules. (*Sometimes tener is used to describe state of being*.)

Tener is used in the following ways:

- To describe possesion
- To describe state of being
- To tell your age

- Yo tengo un lapiz.----> I have a pencil. Yo tengo miedo.----> I am scared. Tengo 5 años.---> I am 5 years old.
- I have----> yo **tengo** yo you have----> tú *tienes* tú you él/ella/Ud. he/she/sir he has----> él **tiene** we have----> nosotros tenemos nosotros we vosotros they/you plural (Spain) they have----> vosotros tenéis ellos/ellas/Uds. they have----> ellos tienen they/you plural (Latin America)
