Explanatory Writing How to Eat Pizza

Objectives & Common Core Connections

- * Introduce the topic for a selected audience.
- * Focus on the purpose of explanatory writing.
- * List the steps.
- * Organize the steps in a logical order.
- * Use linking words to connect ideas.
- * Write an explanatory paragraph.

Introduction Provide each student with a copy of the writing frame (page 36). Have students read the title and first line and study the illustrations. Tell them that they will write a paragraph explaining to classmates how to eat a slice of pizza.

Model Help students begin their explanation by writing an introductory sentence that would be appropriate for fourth graders. For example:

It takes skill to eat pizza.

Point out that when explaining how to make or do something, the writer needs to list the steps. For example:

- fold it lengthwise
- put pointed end in mouth
- quickly slurp up filling that oozes out
- wait for it to cool
- take bite

You might say: *I need to organize the steps in a logical way so that readers can follow them.* Coach students in developing complete sentences. Model how some ideas can be connected with linking words, such as *and*, *also*, or *another*. For example:

- Wait for the pizza to cool.
- Then, fold a slice lengthwise.
- Put the pointed end in your mouth and take a bite.
- Quickly slurp up any topping that oozes out.

Guided Practice Have students complete the writing frame. Encourage them to use their own ideas about eating pizza, as well as their own wording and sentence structure.

Review Invite volunteers to read their finished paragraphs to the class. Have listeners use items 1, 2, 5–7, 9, and 12 on the assessment checklist (page 63) to evaluate the effectiveness of other students' work.

Independent Practice Use the On Your Own activity (page 37) as homework or review. Encourage students to use what they learned in the lesson to complete the assignment. Tell them they can choose a food from the Idea Box or use their own idea.
