un + load = unload un + dress = undress

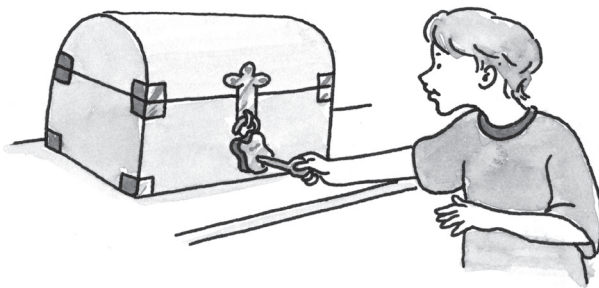
You can add the **prefix dis-** to change the meaning of other words.

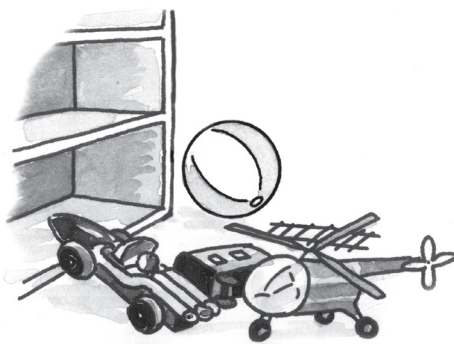

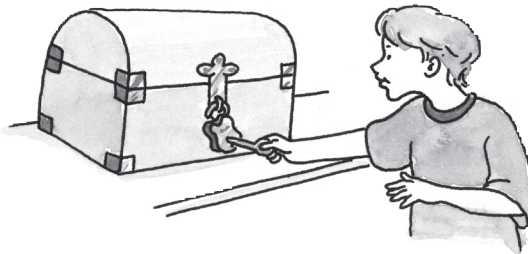

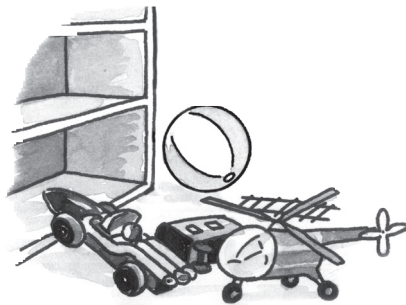
